surrounding communities.



KEY FINANCIALS RESULTS GROWTH OVER OUR 25 YEAR HISTORY


Assets

FROM OUR MANAGING DIRECTOR

2023 completed a year's celebration of the Silver Anniversary of Chisholm Trail Communities Foundation. That milestone caused us to focus even more on the mission and the extraordinary vision of our founders over 25 years ago.

At year-end 2023, our total assets reached a record \$32 million. Our cumulative distributions since our founding also reached a record \$16 million, nearly all of which went to worthy causes in our area. These distributions are made possible by the generosity of our donors; true philanthropists who are making a difference in the town we all love.

The Gary Park project, in partnership with the City of Georgetown, has made excellent progress. The Park is already a terrific facility, and the plans for continued development reveal a truly exceptional flagship park for the community's enjoyment.

CTCF began a renovation of our headquarters, the Mann's Drug Store Building (1880) in 2023, and it was completed in 2024, including the addition of color to the major architectural trim elements. And we had fun by including you, the public, in our "Paint The Building" contest. The building now adds more color to "The Most Beautiful Town Square in Texas." We are very proud of our Deep Roots in Georgetown.

In celebration of its 25th anniversary and building renovation project, CTCF invited the community to help select new trim colors for its historic home on Georgetown's "Most Beautiful Town Square in Texas." The "Paint the Building" contest offered voters three choices — Texas Topaz, Blue Hole Gray, and Prickly Pear Cactus — and a chance to win \$2,500 to donate to a charity of their choice.

Texas Topaz was chosen for the building's new accents. The randomly selected contest winner, Allison Zander, designated The Carver Center for Families as the recipient of the CTCF donation.

The Center is a local community resource hub supported by the Georgetown Health Foundation and STARRY, providing families with essential services, from resource navigation and peer support to family-friendly activities.
